Standing Committee

Clergy: 2 needed for 3-year term

The Rev. Shay Gaillard
(St. Helena's, Beaufort)



Shay is a lifelong member of the Diocese of South Carolina. He grew up at the Cathedral of St. Luke and St. Paul and was the past Coordinator of Youth Ministry for the Diocese as well as the Summer Camp Director at St. Christopher. Shay

attended Trinity School for Ministry and was ordained in 2004. He served as curate at St. Paul's, Conway and Rector at Good Shepherd, Charleston and is currently Rector at St. Helena's, Beaufort. Shay has served on Diocesan Council, the board of St. Christopher and two terms on the Standing Committee.

The Very Rev. Ron Greiser
(Resurrection, Surfside Beach)

Ron is the Rector of the Church of the Resurrection in Surfside Beach and has served as the Rector since May of 2009. He



has served on Diocesan Council for three years, as Chaplin to the Men's Conference, and currently is the Dean of the Georgetown Deanery. He has had the honor of serving on the Executive Committee in the Diocese of Atlanta for three years and Executive Committee, as

Dean of Convocation IV, chair of the Reconciliation Committee and as a member of Congregational Development Committee in the Diocese of Southern Virginia. "If called to serve by the body of Christ, I will work to assist the Diocese to be a vibrant beacon of Anglicanism in North America utilizing its assets to bring people into the saving embrace of Jesus Christ," writes Greiser.

The Rev. Greg Kronz
(St. Luke's, Hilton Head)

Greg is the Rector of St. Luke's, Hilton Head. He has served on the Standing Committee for



two terms and served as the Chair of the Bishop's Search Committee when it called Bishop Mark Lawrence. He has served on two Kairos teams and as Chair of the Diocesan Evangelism Committee. Greg writes "I have been blessed to be the

Clergy: 2 needed for 3-year term

The Rev. Mary Ellen Doran (St. David's / St. Paul's)

In June 2018 Mary Ellen became the pastor for both St. David's, Cheraw and St. Paul's, Bennettsville. Previously she had served as the Assistant Pastor at the Church of Our Savior, Johns Island. A graduate of Charleston



Southern University and Trinity School for Ministry, she previously served two years as Holy Trinity, Charleston's, children's pastor and 12 years at St. James in family ministry. She and her husband Keith have two daughters and two grand-daughters.

The Rev. Brian McGreevy (St. Philip's, Charleston)

Brian serves as Assistant to the Rector of St. Philip's Church, where he oversees ministry to

(St. Michael's, Charleston)

the firm of Weidner, Wegmann and Harper. The practice is primarily in the areas of real estate, probate and general civil litigation. He has been a member of the Parish Church of St. Helena's since 1995, serving one term as a member of the vestry. Married to Mary Heyward (Stevens) for
